

Chokecherry and Sierra Madre Wind Energy Project Estimated to Bring Millions of Dollars to Carbon County

- ✓ Property taxes are based on an estimated project cost of \$4.2 billion \$6.2 billion and an assessed value of \$483 million \$690 million.
 - According to Draft EIS, PCW would be the "single largest taxpayer in the county, by a considerable margin."
 - In first full year, property tax payable is \$29.7 million \$42.4 million.
 - In year 10, property tax payable is \$21.7 million \$31 million.
 - After 10 years, the cumulative property tax total is \$256.9 million \$367 million.
 - Revenues distributed to county, local and statewide public education, special districts. Rawlins benefits indirectly.
- ✓ Sales and use taxes paid on materials and supplies used in the construction are estimated to be \$216 million \$336 million.
 - Revenues distributed to State general fund and local governments, primarily Carbon County, Rawlins, Saratoga and Sinclair.
- ✓ Electricity taxes of \$1 per megawatt-hour will be \$6.1 million \$9.2 million in annual tax receipts, following the 3 year exemption period.
 - Revenues distributed to State general fund and local governments, primarily Carbon County, Rawlins, Saratoga and Sinclair.
- Permanent jobs: 114 high-paying operations & maintenance positions that will contribute to the local tax base and help bring or keep families in Carbon County.
- Construction jobs: projected to peak at 1,189 direct seasonal jobs during the first year, and 1,039, 782 and 818 in the subsequent years.
- Impact assistance dollars may come to the community through the Wyoming Industrial Siting Council process.
